SUMMARY of QUESTIONNAIRE

As promised, yes, I did make this promise, but it was quite a difficult task because there were many and varied answers to the questions. So, I simply listed the more popular answers to each question, then followed this up by listing the less common answers.

1. NOISE - People generally see this night as a social outing and they overlook the fact that this is not the case for everyone; Many come for the music and the dancing; Ask people to catch up during the breaks, not walk around the tables and talk while artists are performing; If music was not so loud, people would not talk so loud; Do not start the night off until everyone is quiet; Name and shame the offenders; Noise is because we run a club, not a concert; The main offenders for talking are guest and walk-up artists, committee members, and a big part of the audience; Noise is frustrating for most people. Try asking for More respect, especially for those who like to listen to the music.

2. THE NEWSLETTER - Enjoy it as it is; Good to learn about what is happening and to hear all the interesting tid-bits and details of shows to come; Ramblings are great but sometimes a bit long and somewhat irrelevant. Maybe just two pages. Newsletter booklet is good, but more information is needed; Really enjoy reading Jilly's "Ramblings". The entire Newsletter is "a wonderful job for all the effort involved"; Love the newsletter and the Ramblings, sad parts also.

3. CMAV SOCIAL NIGHT - Xmas in July idea reasonably well accepted, but cost seemed to be an issue; Why is a special night needed? One Xmas is enough; Some happy to pay; Why not have a Dinner-dance with an outside band, so that all members and workers have a free evening. Also have it catered for; BBQs were great. Is there a club that has BBQ facilities.

4. GUEST ARTISTS - Guest artists have been ok, but not all walk-ups are good. Standard of walk-ups should be addressed; Band is too loud at times - drowns out the singers; People talk more when the walk-ups are on; Good variety with guest artists, some more amazing than others, but you will never please everyone. People are not forced to come - they can stay away if they do not like the artist; Suggestions were made for possible guest artists, e g Bidge Boyd, Russell Erwin, Dennis Bruce, Brian Letton and Sandra Humphries. Are more popular artists sometimes denied because of cost? Can we make the occasional exception?; Maybe put up entry fee; Give less to charity; There are very few places where \$5.00 will give you a full evening's entertainment like CMAV.

GENERAL COMMENTS and SUGGESTIONS

Newsletter is good, but if compere is going to announce certain notices, then what is the use?!; It has been suggested that Club information could be covered on just two A4 pages, no need for a newsletter; Limit band warm-up to 15 minutes; Roster walk-ups to 6 artists, give more time to the guest artist; Walk-ups to sing different songs; Do we need another special night? Maybe incorporate it into a club night with a catered meal, or a theme night where everybody dresses in country gear; Have a social day - 10.30-4.30, and bring a plate 10.30 is too late to finish on Club nights; Band too loud for walk-ups. Then, keep music loud; More frequent breaks; Keep doing same with artists - if they want more money then they do not need our support; Turn the speakers away from tables; Re fruit boxes - suggest 1 for members, and 1 for the raffle.

Once again, many thanks to all who took the time and made the effort to fill out the questionnaire forms. As you can see, the comments were many and varied and I have given you as many details and suggestions as I feel are relevant. Please feel free to discuss any of these points with any of your committee members. I am going to finish this survey with just a few of the more positive comments - "This is a club, not a concert, so there will always be noise." ; "As volunteers you all do a great job, but you cannot be held responsible for those who lack simple respect." ; "Diversity of guest artists is excellent and mostly quite acceptable. Never will all patrons be satisfied." ; "Do not remember not enjoying a CMAV Club night at the Victoria Bowling." ; "Love the Newsletter - it is interesting and informative - love the way it is presented. Keep it going." ; "Jilly's Ramblings are great. Good to hear all the newsy tid-bits, including the sad items." Now, just two final, lovely comments that make us feel that we must be doing something right.

1) "This is our favourite club-it is the best."

2) "Thanks for all the great work , organising everything. We just love coming here."

These 2 comments were from members who had no problems putting their name to their questionnaire. So thank you. In closing , I would like to say that we do have a good club, because we have a pretty dedicated committee, and because we have lots of really awesome members and patrons. who just love their country music ,their dancing, and their friendships, and all these above comments show that you are ready to be involved, and that is so positive. Thanks again.

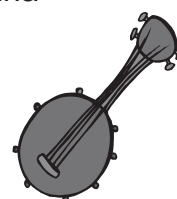

Hoffmans, always good and always popular. They have very recently returned from a tour of certain areas of Scotland and England, and also a mini cruise out of New Zealand. They told us of some of their experiences in a way that is pretty much unique to Heather and David. They are a very down to Earth and popular couple. "Morning Melodies" guest artists in May are also a husband and wife team; Tom Routledge and Patsy McCallum. You will enjoy this very talented couple.

On St. Patrick's Day, 17th of March, at the Victoria Bowling Club, a very lucky crowd enjoyed a great night of entertainment featuring Pete Smith, country singer and bush balladeer, along with his whip-cracking wife Sandie. I am told that it was a night with a difference. Pete and Sandie are a couple of relaxed and easy-going Aussies. They felt very well accepted here in Ballarat and would love to come back another time.

It is hard to believe that Easter 2016 has already come and gone. Time seems to have quite literally spread it's wings, and now we are almost a third of the way through the year. Daylight saving is back on track as from last weekend, but I must be honest , I really like the longer evenings of light, but then I do not have cows to milk and other such things! and the atmosphere was amazing. It certainly involves a lot of hard work and I remember how good it felt to be just one small part of that whole scene. Artists including Kiara Rodriguez, Cynthia Lawrence, Charlie McCracken, Amber Joy Poulton, Joe Musico and Brian Letton all made for a great few days of entertainment, along with a Busking Competition and walk-up artists. I feel sure that just about everyone knows of Glen Campbell. Rhinestone Cowboy is still a very well-known & popular song. Glen Campbell was born on 22nd April in 1936. He is the very much loved Father of three children, who are all musical. Sadly, in 2011, he was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease, although he did not officially retire until the end of his farewell tour in 2014. He is currently living in a memory care facility in Nashville where musical therapy is proving helpful and he is with doctors, lawyers and others, all with the same affliction, and he is happy.

It was sad to hear of the passing of Ronnie Corbett. I mention it because I picked up a comment made by someone on Facebook, and I agreed with every word. The comment was that Ronnie Corbett had good control of the English language, and he could make everyone laugh without using ugly swear words. 😊

The very popular Hartwood Country Music Festival was back over the Easter weekend. The property was sold last year by Paul McCloud and the Festival was put on hold for a year. It is a big property - 1680 Acres - now owned by Chrys and Maria Kelly. Apparently the weekend was a huge success. Hundreds of caravans were set up in bushland, weather was perfect as was the entertainment. Sounds like a good place to visit.

Several of our members have been unwell and at least three have been in hospital. Warmest wishes to each and every one of you and may you soon be again enjoying good health.

RECIPE - BLACKBERRY CHOCOLATE CAKE

Ingredients:

250g butter, chopped

250g good-quality dark chocolate, roughly chopped

1/3 cup milk : 1 cup caster sugar

4 eggs, at room temperature, separated

1/3 cup plain flour : 150g frozen blackberries

Solid chocolate Easter eggs, extra blackberries and cocoa powder, to serve

Method:

Step 1 - Preheat oven to 200°C. Grease and line a 23cm (base) spring form pan with baking paper. Melt butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Set aside.

Step 2 - Combine chocolate and milk in a large heatproof bowl. Place over a saucepan of simmering water (don't let base of bowl touch water). Heat, stirring with a metal spoon, until melted and smooth. Using an electric hand mixer, beat in sugar. Remove bowl from heat. Set aside for 10 minutes to cool slightly.

Step 3 - Add egg yolks, 1 at a time, to chocolate mixture, beating well after each addition. Add melted butter. Stir until combined.

Step 4 - Sift flour over chocolate mixture. Gently fold in. Whisk eggwhites in a separate bowl until soft peaks form. Gently fold into chocolate mixture. Sprinkle over blackberries. Gently fold in until combined.

Step 5 - Spoon mixture into prepared pan. Bake for 15 minutes or until risen. Reduce oven to 160°C. Bake for a further 50 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Leave to cool completely in pan (don't worry if cake sinks in centre).

Step 6 - Place cake onto a serving plate. Decorate with chocolate eggs and blackberries. Dust with cocoa. Serve slices with mascarpone or thick cream, if desired.
